KIA & HYUNDAI OWNERS

Property crimes continue to reach record levels throughout the region. Of that, auto theft is skyrocketing within Pierce County. We are seeing this trend affect DuPont as well. To add to this issue, if you own a Kia from 2011 or newer or a Hyundai from 2015 or newer, your vehicle may now be specifically targeted by auto thieves. There is a new "Tik-Tok Challenge" detailing how to steal Kias and Hyundais that have keyed ignitions (as opposed to push button start) by utilizing a USB cable (See the news link below). If you own these vehicles, please consider parking them securely within a garage, or using a mechanical steering wheel locking device. If you have questions about the type of locking device to purchase or how to use them, you are welcome to come by the police station during business hours (Mon-Fri, 8a-5p) and an officer can assist you.
