Mail Theft Prevention

Vandalism or intentional damage to mailboxes with no evidence of mail theft in DuPont is the jurisdiction of the DuPont Police Department. However, the theft of mail is a federal offense under the jurisdiction of the Postal Inspector.

Checks, gift cards, cash, and other items that can contain personal information such as social security numbers, dates of birth, or account numbers that might be used to steal someone's identity are all popular with thieves.

Below are a few simple tips to help prevent becoming a victim of mail theft:

- Don't let mail accumulate. Make checking your mailbox part of your daily routine.
- If you have outgoing mail, drop it in the mailbox first thing in the morning or take it directly to the post office. Don't leave mail in the box overnight!
- If you're going to be out of town, request the post office temporarily stop the delivery of your mail.

- Sign up for Informed Delivery through the postal service. This free service provides you with an image of your mail that is being delivered so you know what to expect, along with status updates for packages.
