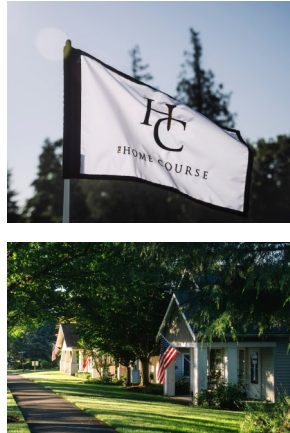

What is Puget Sound? “Puget Sound Starts Here” says it is...

- A deep estuary – where saltwater and freshwater merge.
- A huge region, stretching from the Cascade Mountains in the east to the Olympic Mountains in the west and from the Canadian border in the north to Mt. Rainier in the south.
- A region made up of our local rivers and streams that flow through the region and eventually drain into Puget Sound, as well as the land that drains into these local bodies of water.
- If you live here, you know that Puget Sound is more than water. It’s a diverse landscape filled with cities, suburbs, and agricultural areas. It’s a thriving economic area.
- The land and water of Puget Sound and intrinsically connected. We rely on Puget Sound for healthy food, recreational opportunities, as well as a large part of our state’s economy. In turn, the health of Puget Sound and the creatures that rely on it are directly impacted by what happens on the land all around them.
- The region covering 1.6 million acres (2,500 square miles) across 12 counties and is the place that approximately 4.3 million people call home.

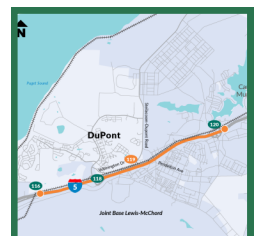

NEWS FROM PATROL

- Officers were dispatched to a domestic violence call at a residence where family members were involved in a physical altercation. One person was arrested for Assault in the 4th Degree and charges were referred to the Prosecutor for another family member.
- An officer was initially advised by dispatch that a vehicle was reported to have driven over a median on a city street, hit a road sign and left the scene. While investigating the hit and run and speaking to the registered owners, officers determined that a physical domestic violence incident had occurred between spouses. One person was arrested and booked into jail for Assault in the 4th Degree.
- Officers were dispatched to a burglary in progress at a local school. An individual matching the description of the suspect was found on the premises and booked into jail.

Safety message - Tips for EV - Safe Charging at Home



Electric Vehicles: Safe Charging at Home

SAFETY TIPS

- Use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Read and follow all manufacturer directions.
- Check chargers and cords for damage before using. Never use if damaged.
- Do not use extension cords with the charger.
- Install charging equipment in safe locations. Keep away from busy areas and things that could catch fire.
- Keep charging items out of reach of children and animals when not in use.
- Cover charging station outlet to keep water out.
- Before charging an electric vehicle at home, have a qualified electrician:
 - ~ Check your electrical system to see if it can handle charging.
 - ~ Install a new circuit just for your charging device.

Warning!

- ⚡ Electric vehicles have high voltage batteries.
- ⚡ Battery maintenance should be performed by the manufacturer.
- ⚡ Do not touch the orange high voltage cables.



For Level 1 Charging:

- Use the charging cord that came with the electric vehicle.
- Use a standard household plug.
- Make sure charger or outlet has GFCI protection.
- Use only a dedicated circuit to charge.

For Level 2 Charging:

- Use a 240-volt outlet. A qualified electrician needs to install this type of outlet.
- Only use outdoor rated charging stations outdoors.
- Keep cords off the ground.

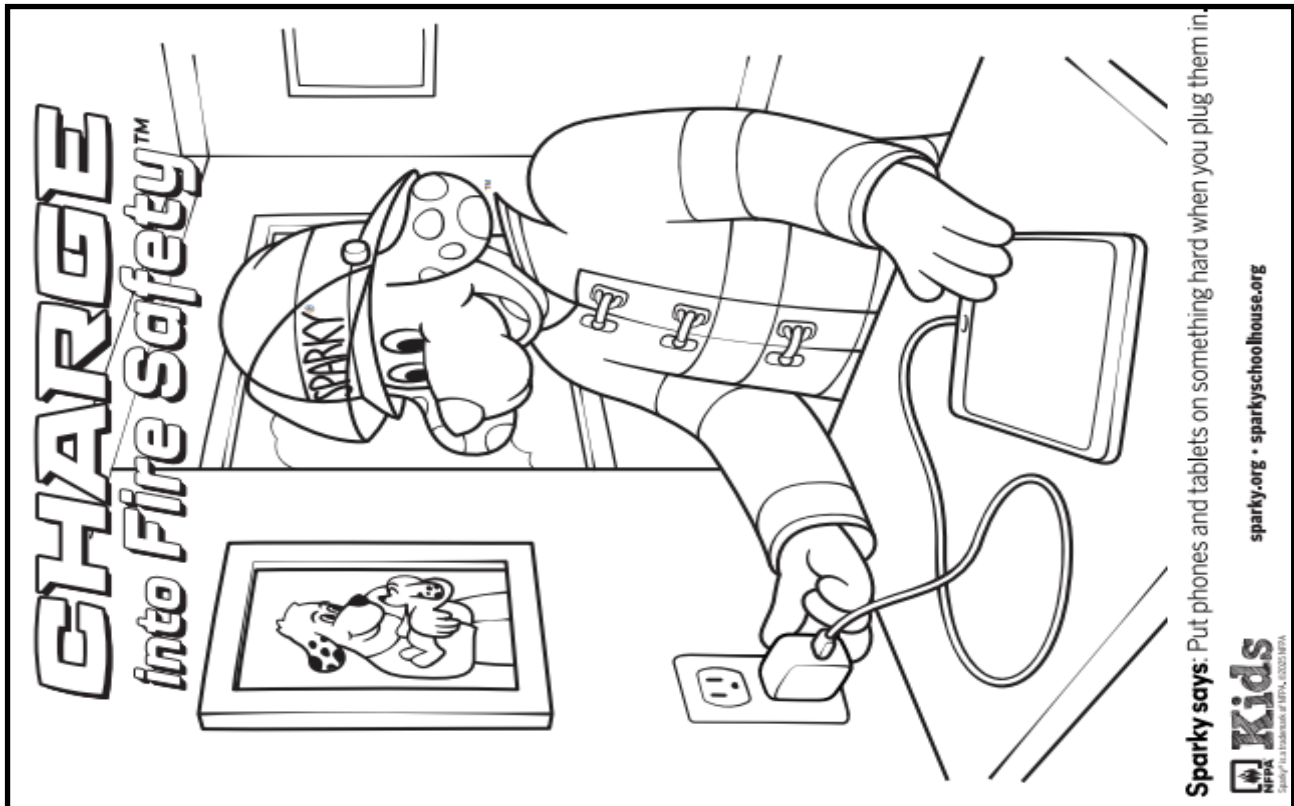
