



Safety Message: As the air gets cooler and seasonal activities begin, it's important to keep fire safety at the top of your mind.

City of DuPont Fire Department - Fall Fire Safety Guide

The following tips can help you protect your home, family, and community during the fall season.

Check and Maintain Smoke Alarms

- **Install Smoke Alarms:** Ensure you have working smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of your home, including the basement.
- **Test Monthly:** Press the test button regularly to confirm alarms are functioning. Replace alarms that are over 10 years old or do not respond to testing.
- **Battery Care:** Check and replace smoke alarm batteries as needed.

Heater and Fireplace Safety

- **Keep a Safe Distance:** Maintain at least three feet of clearance between heaters, fireplaces, wood stoves, and any flammable objects.
- **Use Fireplace Screens:** Always use a safety screen to keep sparks from igniting nearby items.
- **Inspect and Clean:** Have your chimney professionally inspected and cleaned each year to reduce the risk of chimney fires.

Cooking with Care

- **Stay in the Kitchen:** Never leave cooking food unattended. Unattended cooking is a leading cause of home fires.
- **Supervise Kids and Pets:** Keep children and pets away from the stove and other hot surfaces.
- **Use Timers:** Set timers, especially during busy holiday meal preparation, to prevent food from burning or catching fire.

Outdoor Fire and Yard Maintenance

- **Clean Up Leaves and Debris:** Dry leaves can easily ignite. Clear them away from your home, especially near decks, gutters, and outdoor heating equipment.
- **Practice Safe Fire Pit Use:** Keep fire pits a safe distance from your home, structures, and overhanging trees. Fully extinguish fires before leaving them unattended.
- **Dispose of Ashes Properly:** Cool ashes completely in water and store them in a metal container—never in paper, plastic, or cardboard.

Be Prepared for Emergencies

- **Review Your Family's Fire Escape Plan:** Make sure everyone in your household knows two ways out of each room and a designated meeting place outside.
- **Practice Your Drill:** Regularly rehearse your escape plan so everyone can act quickly and safely.
- **Stock Your Emergency Kit:** Prepare for seasonal power outages by ensuring your kit includes flashlights, fresh batteries, first-aid supplies, and other essentials.
