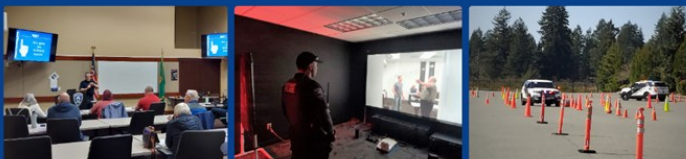

The City Clerk's Office serves as the official filing center for all City resolutions, ordinances, contracts, minutes, and documents adopted by the City Council.

Other functions of the City Clerk are to coordinate the production and distribution of meeting materials, including agendas and packets for City Council Meetings, provide legal and public notifications, and produce official meeting minutes.

Public Notices are easy to find on the Clerk's webpage. From the homepage, click GOVERNMENT, DEPARTMENTS, ADMINISTRATION, and then CITY CLERK. On the Clerk's page, click **PUBLIC NOTICES**.

Public Notices announce the cancelation of a meeting, public hearings, the scheduling of a special meetings, and possible quorums of the City Council.

For Municipal Agency notices, when published, they can be found on their own pages under GOVERNMENT and then **COMMISSIONS**.

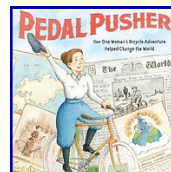

## Rental Housing Business License Renewal



At this time, the City has suspended issuing Rental Housing Licenses for 2026. The suspension comes from the administrative authority of the Mayor. This does not prevent a homeowner from renting their house, it just pauses the requirement that a license is required to do so.

This came about from concerns from staff that the current program was not effective, was difficult to enforce, and cost more money to administer than what was received in revenues. The administrative pause allows staff to review and make a formal recommendation for changes, updates, or repeal.

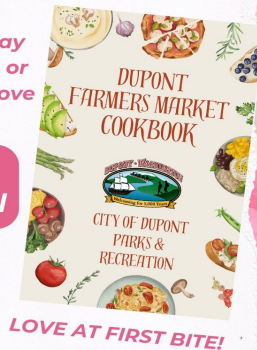

## Vehicle Break-In & Theft Prevention



**Crimes of opportunity are easily preventable!**

### **LOCK YOUR VEHICLE**

Locking your vehicle doors is the first step in deterring a thief.

### **REMOVE YOUR KEYS**

If your key is in the ignition, a thief can simply break a window and drive off. Never leave your vehicle running without someone in it.

### **CLOSE YOUR WINDOWS**

Keep your windows closed completely. A thief can easily reach into your car through an open window

### **PARK IN WELL-LIT AREAS OR GARAGE**

Thieves may be deterred if they know they can easily be seen.

### **DON'T LEAVE VALUABLES IN YOUR CAR**

One way to attract a thief is to leave a purse or wallet, cell phone, laptop, or other high value item in a visible area of your car. If you must leave items in your vehicle hide them where they can't be easily seen.

### **BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS**

If you're concerned about the safety of your vehicle or spot someone prowling around the area, park somewhere else if possible.

## Safety Tips for generators, gas-powered equipment, and extension cords:

### Generators & Gas-Powered Equipment

- Operate generators outdoors, away from windows, doors, vents, and buildings.
- Use heavy-gauge cords rated above appliance amperage.
- Never run gas-powered equipment indoors (snow blowers, chainsaws, lawn tools, pressure washers).
- Refuel outside in fresh air; avoid spills and wait before starting engine.
- Install CO detectors, especially in garages.
- Store gasoline safely in approved containers, away from ignition sources; never indoors.

### Extension Cord Safety

- Inspect cords for damage; discard if frayed, cracked, or burnt.
- Use UL/ETL-listed cords sized for the load.
- Keep cords dry; use GFCI outlets in damp/wet areas.
- Unplug immediately if cord feels hot.
- Use outdoor-rated cords outside; never modify cords or plugs.
- Maintain vehicle connections; replace worn cords and use proper gauge for block heaters.
- Use timers for vehicle block heaters instead of leaving on overnight.
