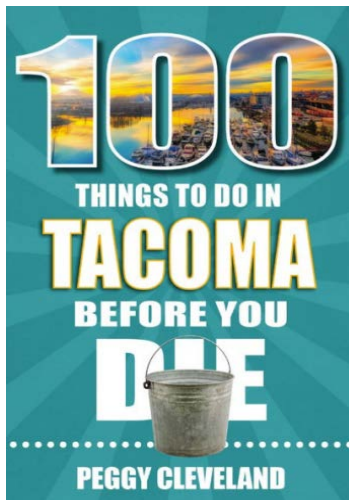

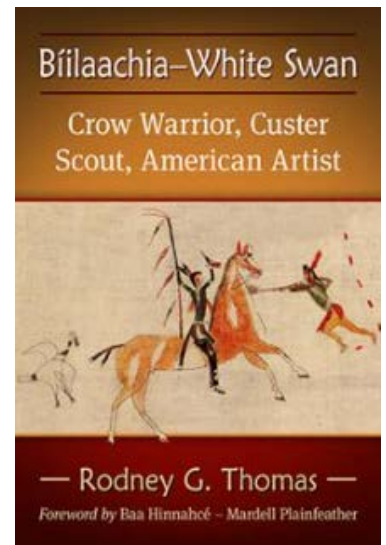


Upcoming Events at the DuPont Museum -

STORIES FROM PATROL: OUR CITY'S PUBLIC SAFETY TEAM...

On Sunday, our heroic DuPont Fire Department has an emergency 9-1-1 response to cardiac arrest in progress. Upon arrival, active CPR was initiated. Working as a team, DPD patrol officers responded to offer support. According to one of our own DuPont Firefighters, "Shortly after our arrival a DPD officer showed up and he was able to take over compressions so I could work on the patient's airway and allow my medic to start an IV. Very shortly after that, another DPD Officer showed up and was able to also assist with compressions until JBLM arrived. We were able to get pulses back on the patient and transport to Madigan...."

DUPONT POLICE NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH CRIME PREVENTION TIP

Fall is the perfect time for working in the yard, winterizing your home, and making some easy changes that will not only spruce up the exterior of your property, but also create a safer environment for you and your family.

Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)

- Keep shrubs trimmed to three feet and prune the lower branches of trees up to seven feet to maintain clear visibility.
- Keep the exterior of your home clean and well maintained.
- Use walkways and landscaping to direct visitors to the proper entrance and away from private areas.
- Provide appropriate illumination for sidewalks, exterior doors, and all areas of the yard.
- Add a gate latch to the front yard fence – this will require a few extra seconds for someone to open it.
- Replace inadequate door and window locks with good security hardware such as deadbolts.

MAKING PUBLIC COMMENTS DURING MEETINGS

Before COVID, to make public comment, citizens spoke during meetings attended in-person or submitted comments that were shared with the members. COVID changed many things in business, including how citizens can attend meetings and make public comments.

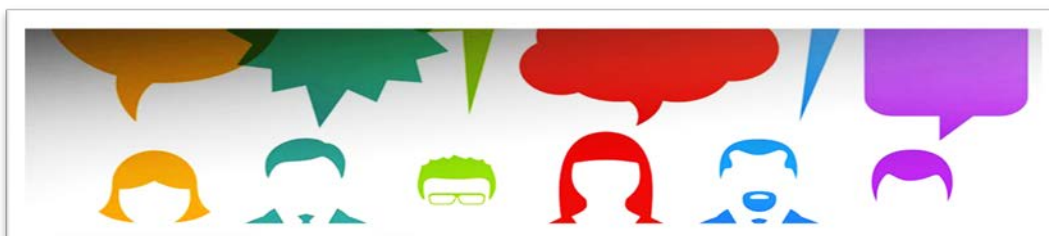
Hybrid meetings are now a normal way of conducting business by combining in-person and remote access. The City of DuPont uses the online tools of Zoom.us and YouTube.com. Each of these have different purposes, and when combined, they allow citizens a chance to call in and comment (Zoom.us) and watch the meeting live (YouTube.com).

The City Council and Municipal Agencies welcome the public to meetings and encourage public comment. Detailed instructions to make public comment are linked to every agenda and also posted on the website on the City Clerk's page under "Public Notices" or found at the following link: <https://www.dupontwa.gov/116/Public-Notices>.

Please note, Zoom is not a method to watch meetings; go to the City's YouTube Channel (link above) to watch the meeting live and to know when the public comment periods are in progress.

IMPORTANT TIPS:

- If you are making public comment remotely through Zoom, it is best if you join the meeting a few minutes before the meeting begins and then wait until the public comment period(s) of the meeting.
- During the public comment period(s) of the agenda, you will be remotely admitted into the meeting and called upon to make your comments.
- At that time, turn off the volume on all other devices and when you are unmuted by the Clerk, please provide your name and city of residence, and then provide your comments.
- Once the time limit is reached, you can either hang up or you will be transferred back into the Zoom "waiting room". You can resume watching the meeting live on YouTube.
- Each speaker will be allowed three (3) minutes to speak during the Public Comment / Testimony sections of the agenda; any other time limit is identified on the agenda.

Private Medic Information: Over the last week, DuPont Fire responded to 14 emergency calls and mutual aid was received twice. A paramedic was on duty 5 of the 7 shifts. The calls are broken down as follows:

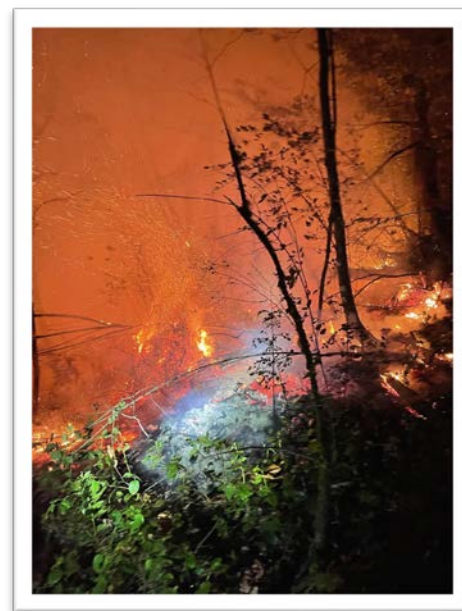

Recent Brush Fire Update

The recent brush fire in DuPont on Saturday, October 15, 2022, was successful contained with no homes damaged and no injuries were reported. Below is a timeline of events:

October 15, 2022

- 6:48 PM: DuPont Fire was dispatched for a smoke investigation near Sinclair and Grant.
- 6:56 PM: DuPont E25 arrived and began to investigate. E25's crew accessed the trail behind the homes and found a 50x50 slow moving brush fire, which was not threatening any structures. The fire was approximately 2000' into the woods behind Sinclair in a wooded area that was difficult to access. Crews extended over 2000' of hose to reach the fire.
- 7:05 PM: Captain Reynolds, the initial Incident Commander, requested additional resources from JBLM and a request for DNR's air resources was made but denied due to no daylight.
- 7:19 PM: An additional request for an engine from West Pierce Fire & Rescue (WPFR) was made.
- B-20 arrived from WPFR and was eventually released. Assistant Chief Creekmore assumed command with the arrival of DuPont E23. DuPont's Public Works was notified of the use of the hydrant on Sinclair and the on-duty staff member monitored the situation.



DUPONT FIRE DEPARTMENT continued...

- 8:40 PM: Chief Creekmore requested three additional brush trucks and one engine to allow the release of the JBLM and WPFR resources. He also requested DNR for hand crews, which was denied.
- 9:12 PM: The fire was contained (knocked down and a significant line was dug around the fire). A request for a private ambulance to move into DuPont was made to cover any medical calls, but no units were available.
- 10:21 PM: JBLM and WPFR resourced were released.
- 10:59 PM: The three additional brush trucks and engine were released after improvements were made to the fire line.
- 11:58 PM: After a check of the fire, command was terminated and a plan for the next operation period was made that included:
 - Check the fire in after 2 hours.
 - Communicate with DNR by 7:00 AM as to the status and to determine if any resources could be available.
 - Request County Resources at 8:00 AM if DNR declined.
 - "Call back" for Firefighters.
 - Check if a private ambulance could move up for medical coverage

October 16, 2022

- 7:00 AM: Discussions with DNR resulted in no available resources.
- 8:27 AM: Crews provided additional mop-up efforts.
- 9:36 AM: A request for a Faulk unit was made and confirmed to cover medical calls. Captain Reynolds evaluated the fire location and determined fewer resources were need for final mop up and units from JBLM responded.
- 12:40 PM: Mop-up was complete, and all equipment was picked up and returned to Station 25.
