SIDEWALK TEAM UPDATE

The Sidewalk Team has been working to finish leveling sidewalk panels on Charles St., which is the final street to be completed in the Yehle Village. A handful of sidewalk panels still need to be pulled and formed for new concrete pours (weather permitting) before the team moves to a new area. The crew did have to pause due to the excavator needing its 2000-hour service. It should be back in operation in about a week.

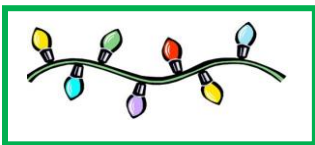
Once the work on Charles St. is finished, the team and equipment will move into Hoffman Hill Village. The current schedule is to begin on O'Brien St. by mid-November.

Fire Safety Tip - Check your Heating System!

Here are a few things you can do to reduce the risk of furnace fires:

- Regularly replace furnace filters.
- Keep all areas around the furnace clean and unobstructed.
- Keep the burner area clean and clear of debris.
- Keep all combustible items at least six inches away from the vent pipe.
- Never close off more than 20% of heat registers.
- If there are any issues with your heating system, contact a professional immediately.
- For preventative care, have your central heating system cleaned and serviced by a certified HVAC contractor once annually.
