

To all DuPont Citizens, I wanted to reach out and assure each of you that all City departments are working to maintain essential City operations during this difficult time while the entire nation, the entire world, works to stem the spread of the Novel Corona virus COVID 19. The City government is fully operational and doing its part in this effort.


Based on the recommendations of the Center for Disease Control, the Washington State Department of Health, and the Governor's March 16th, 2020 proclamation and in consultation with my staff and our public safety departments, the City will enact and enforce the following.

- All City programs and events are postponed or cancelled for the months of March and April.
- All City business meetings, including but not limited to City Council meetings, workshops, and all agency or committee meetings, are cancelled for the months of March and April.
- Special City Council meetings may be held for necessary City business and will be scheduled and noted in accordance with law.
- City Hall and our Public Safety departments are still functioning, please do not hesitate to call if you have City business. However, the lobby areas and public access to all City buildings and facilities are closed until further notice.
- All schools have been closed until April 24, 2020. The City cannot provide daycare or meal services for school-children.
- In accordance with the Governor's proclamation, all gatherings of 50 or more persons must be cancelled.
- In accordance with the Governor's proclamation, all bars and restaurants must be closed for in room dining. Take out service and drive-through windows are still permitted to operate.

Additionally, as your mayor I strongly urge each of you to take all recommended precautions. Wash your hands frequently, avoid touching your face, avoid groups, and keep a distance of at least six feet between you and others. If you are 60 years of age or older, or are immuno-compromised in any way, please, stay at home and limit your contact with others. If you are under sixty and healthy, please, limit your contact with others to only what is truly essential.

DuPont is a strong community. We can and we will prevail by helping one another. This will be a time of sacrifice as we navigate the unknown. Help each other by being kind and considerate. Be patient with yourself and others. Help your neighbors and offer any assistance you can while keeping yourself safe. The City is operational and all essential services, including police and fire, are here to help.
