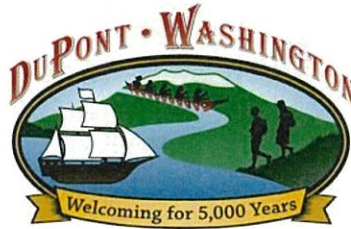

MAYOR'S DIRECTIVE

To all DuPont Citizens,

On March 23, 2020 Governor Jay Inslee issued a Proclamation "Stay Home – Stay Healthy" directing all Washington residents to immediately cease leaving their homes or place of residence except to conduct or participate in essential activities or employment in essential business services. The Governor has made it clear that while restrictions may be eased, they will not be removed all at once and much of the proclamation's restrictions will stay in effect for the weeks to come. Even as businesses slowly reopen, social distancing will most likely remain for some time to come.

The last few weeks have been trying for all of us and many sacrifices have been made. We have all seen a growing unrest, in our communities and across the country. I implore each individual and each family in DuPont to stay the course.

Now is not a time to turn on each other, but to sustain one another. Businesses will reopen slowly in the coming weeks and months. Please continue to support our local businesses.

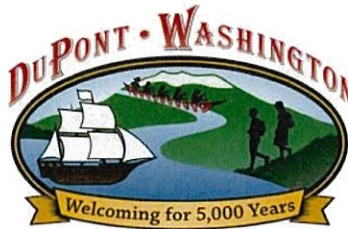
Please do not confront individuals or groups that you think are not complying with the continuing "Stay at Home" proclamation. There are many exemptions to the proclamation, and groups living together will naturally be in close proximity to one another. You may not know the entire situation you are observing.

I urge each of you to exercise understanding and maturity and consider calling the police if you feel there is a violation of the "Stay at Home" proclamation. Do not use social media, direct phone calls to City staff or elected officials to report these types of activities. If you see something that is concerning enough to notify authorities, you may call the police non-emergency dispatch number at 253-798-4721 so that the DuPont Police Department can be notified in a timely manner and the call can be handled via the standard response process and by priority of call.

Again, whether engaging in essential activities or those allowed activities in the coming weeks and months as the state and City reopens, please continue to follow the Center for Diseases Control's guidelines. These precautions include the following:

- Maintain at least 6 feet from other individuals.
- Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds as frequently as possible or use hand sanitizer.
- Cover coughs or sneezes and do not shake hands.
- Refrain from touching your face, particularly eyes, nose and mouth.
- Perform routine environmental cleaning with a sanitizing product.
- Wear a face mask if it appears you cannot avoid appropriate distancing
