LTAC APPLICATIONS

MEYER'S STORMWATER POND MAINTENANCE

The stormwater pond located between Meyer ST and MacArthur ST maintenance is complete and the original construction capacity of the pond was restored. See before and after photos.



CENTER DR / MCNEIL ST STORMWATER POND MAINTENANCE

Similar work is ongoing this week at this pond to remove built up silt and vegetation. This pond receives stormwater from the retail/restaurant district around Wilmington DR, Ross AVE, McNeil ST, and McDonald AVE.

WATER PRODUCTION

Monday, August 17, 2020, the local temperature was 95 degrees F, and coincided with our highest daily water production (24-hour period) for the year; 3.2 Million gallons of water produced. This is associated with increased irrigation demand citywide during the hot day.

WATER METER READING

Public Works staff started and completed citywide water meter reading this week. This data from over 3,100 water meters is collected for the end-of-month utility billing.
