City Hall Opening July 1

The City of DuPont reopened city facilities on July 1st, this includes City Hall, the Police Department lobby, and the Community Center. The safety of our community and city staff is the top priority for DuPont and we look forward to welcoming the public back to city buildings.

Council Meetings

Public meetings will continue to be exclusively on Zoom until the Emergency Proclamation is lifted. The Governor’s Proclamation 20-28 states all public agencies must provide a remote participation option for their public meetings. Our Council Chambers is not equipped with the technological capabilities to host virtual meetings. Once the proclamation is lifted, meetings will resume in Council Chambers and open for the public to physically attend.

Council Meetings are the second Tuesday of the month at 6:30 PM. They are available to watch on the City’s YouTube channel and PCTV.
