## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

### Pioneer Aggregates (CalPortland) Mine Expansion

The Community Development Department has just started the permitting process for the Pioneer Aggregates (CalPortland) mine expansion. The proposal under review is to begin mining the South Parcel that was designated as part of the Mineral Resource Overlay in 2006, which consists of 188-acres.

The virtual open house provides an opportunity to view materials on the project to expand mining to the South Parcel and learn about applicable review procedures. 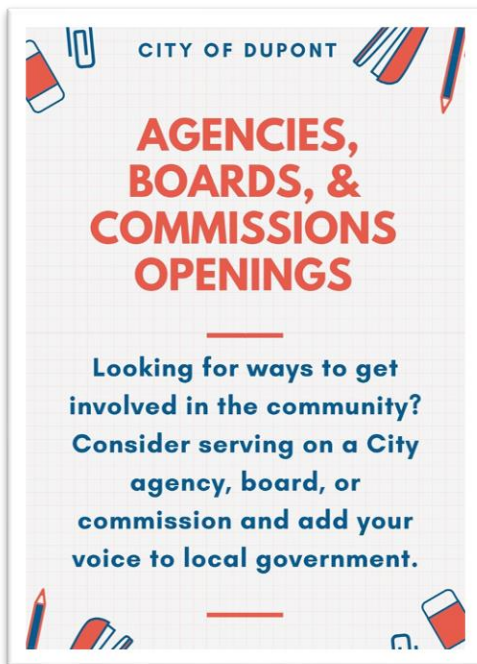
## **PET LICENSES**
